As political leaders, we measure our success in terms of progress: how far we have come in advancing the interests of our constituents.

2020 saw the first reversal in human development for the last thirty years.

The pandemic pushed more than 100 million people into extreme poverty.

Approximately 118 million more face chronic hunger.

Vaccines have been deployed unevenly and economies have suffered unequally.

Past development in both gender equity and access to education has been erased.

We cannot build back. We must build back better.

The European Union believes we must seize this opportunity to build a more inclusive and sustainable world.

Over the past year, Team Europe mobilised more than 46 billion euros to help our partners fight the pandemic.

This support has allowed governments to strengthen health and social protection spending.

We have also driven global debt relief efforts.
